Rho Lambda, the National Sorority Leadership Recognition Society, was founded at the University of Miami as a local group in 1962 under the direction of Dean Louise P. Mills. To date, over 229 chapters have been chartered throughout North America, all sharing the common goal of recognizing sorority women for their outstanding leadership.

The procedures for chartering at this time are as follows:

- 1. Upon receipt of a request to form a "New Organization" through the OrgSync Membership Portal, the National Office will contact the person who submitted the form with additional instructions.
- 2. Upon contact from the National Office, the chartering institution must submit a \$75.00 chartering fee to the National Office. The National Office will then send the appropriate rituals and paraphernalia to the newly-created chapter.
- 3. Each time the chapter elects new members, the names of those selected must be entered into the OrgSync "New Member Initiation Fee" form for the proper recording by the National Office and to ensure that membership certificates will be forthcoming. A single check should be mailed to the National Office to cover the \$15.00 per initiate fee. There is no charge for honorary initiates.
- 4. The various functions which are sponsored or undertaken by the local chapters include the following activities and programs:
 - a. Greek Week
 - b. Panhellenic Scholarship Program
 - c. Community Service Projects
 - d. Fund raising projects for the purpose of financial assistance to sorority
 - women in need.
 - e. Cultural and/or professional lecture programs

Although Rho Lambda Sorority Recognition Society is an honorary, it is advised that they take an active role in utilizing their leadership in one or more of the above areas.
